BOW - Best of West

Best of West has been calculated there is 185 days until 24th November Week 8 Term 4 which is the cut off. 172 Days is 93%, this is the schools expectation of attendance. 157 Days allows 15 days exemption eg; Covid, sport, and other family events etc.

157 x 3 stars = 471 Stars

For your child to receive Best of West they will need 471 Stars. As explained, this allows 15 days exemption also.

If you have long periods of absenteeism then it is parents/carers responsibility to email the **class teacher** if they are wanting an exemption other than these 15 days.

Teachers then put this email to the committee and they will either approve this or decline.
